The Church At Its Best (Part 2) - Living as Both "Inherited" and "New"

First Church,

A few weeks ago I began sharing a bit more on the direction of First Church moving forward. In the book of Acts we see how God used both more "inherited" forms of church and brand "new" or "fresh" expressions of Church to share the Gospel in a world that did not know the Gospel.

I believe this is a helpful, and needed, model for First Church to embrace today as well. In particular, these two forms of church can have a "synergistic" effect on each other. The more inherited form of church offers a rich sense of history, reputation, and mature disciples who can send out disciples into the world. The fresh expressions of ministry can offer a new sense of vitality, experimentation, and ability to meet people on their turf to share the Gospel. Both are needed. Both have been used by God as the book of Acts shows.

From my perspective, this is exactly the type of church God desires today. Yet, interestingly, this model of church is hardly ever found in our current American culture. Most churches exist only in an inherited model (gathering every Sunday morning, in a building, with paid staff members), or a new church plant/fresh expression model (meeting in gyms, or coffee shops, or any other 3rd space but without much connection beyond themselves). But what IF a church could learn to live with a symbiotic relationship between the two? THIS is exactly the opportunity that I believe First Church has to offer.

The beauty of this model is that it allows First Church to more fully live into its vision of "Transformation In Christ, Changing Lives Inside And Out." In this model of "inherited" and "new" we can see lives changed in the facilities of First Church, but also out in the community. We can see lives changed inwardly in our souls, but also outwardly as we seek to send out people to serve and connect in the world.

What this means practically is that we must organize ourselves in such a way as to embrace the duel model. In the next pastor's page I will go into more detail on this. We have already begun moving in this direction as we continue to invest in elements often associated with inherited forms of church such as children's ministry, youth ministry, and powerful worship while at the same time cultivating new pioneers to send out for fresh expressions of ministry such as with the Acts Network. However—and here is the beautiful synergy that begins to be created—please do not read this as all inherited ministries exist without elements of fresh expressions. And please do not read that fresh expressions do not benefit from some of the longevity of more inherited ministries. We believe the two "rub off" on each other in wonderful, creative ways whereby fresh expressions of ministry will be happening in more inherited ministries, and more inherited ministries will help guide emerging forms of fresh expressions.
