

With these changes in responsibility, our staff will also be operating under a new organizational chart which directly reflects those ministries that contribute primarily to the inherited church model as well as those ministries which contribute primarily to fresh expressions of church (such as the Acts Network). In saying this, I would remind us again here to remember there will also be overlap as the strengths of each of these forms of ministry benefit one another! Under all of these changes will be the fostering of a more missional and incarnational DNA, designed to help us focus on becoming multiplying disciples.

We believe these changes give us the greatest chance to remove barriers to growth and do what no other church in the Susquehanna United Methodist Conference has been able to do by consistently growing past 800 folks in regular worship.

These are significant endeavors and steps of faith. I would ask for your deep, regular, and heart-felt prayers... and that our heartbeat would grow ever stronger around our vision of "Transformation In Christ, Changing Lives Inside and Out."

I remain so very grateful to take these steps of faith with a people like you, First Church.

The Church At Its Best (Part 3) - Living as Both "Inherited" and "New"

First Church,

In the last few Pastor Pages I have laid out some of the theology and philosophy behind this model of church.

Today I want to focus on some of the practical implications of living into this model. Specifically, I want to help us understand the role that our staff will be playing as we live into this model of ministry. Recently we have begun to implement very significant staff transitions to help us as a church grow into this model of embracing "inherited" and "new." The consultant we have worked with, Wade Burnett from Multi-Site Solutions, believes First Church can grow someday to 1200 weekly worshippers just in our Sunday morning gatherings and then at that time have the ability to launch new sites in other locations. However, "Counting Worshippers" is not as straight forward as one might think. For example, we have folks who worship online, at times other than Sunday morning, and in connection with our Acts Network (which currently has around 380 people connected, but are not all worshipping yet). So, one of our first tasks in reaching 1200 in worship will be to determine how we are going to count! Such is the age in which we live!

What we DO already know is that to get to 1200 and beyond in regular worship attendance, there are many ways that we will have to grow and adapt. Thankfully we have a staff team willing to make the necessary changes and adaptations to do whatever we can to see maximum Kingdom impact. (For us that means the most amount of lives transformed inside and out in Jesus Christ possible!).

Therefore, many of our staff will be taking on new or adjusted roles as of July 1 of this year. Those with significant changes include:

- *Jake Bair will continue to give time and energy to worship in the CLC, but he will also focus on better communication for First Church.
- *Aaron Russell will continue to work with college ministry, but he will also work at helping us develop a more vibrant culture of discipleship at the CLC.
- *Rick Waters will oversee our pastoral care, but also oversee our community outreach.
- *Two new part-time roles will be created in relation to the FEC worship. One will be entitled the Director of FEC Worship and one will be a designated worship leader. In this set-up Desire Bower will continue to work in the worship area and will focus her attention on supporting the work of the Director of FEC Worship.
- *Pastor Janet will be moving into a role with expanded responsibility as our Executive Pastor designed to focus on increased ministry alignment and discipleship. In this role, Pastor Janet will no longer be directly leading our worship ministry.
- *Pastor Matt will be giving more time to strategic planning, communication, vision casting, and the shaping of healthy ministry culture at First Church.
