One of the reasons that we are asking folks to take this survey is to help us better understand the culture at First Church as we prepare for some next steps, one of which we are calling the Acts Network.

As we have shared, the Acts Network will be a network of micro communities of deep discipleship who offer fresh expressions of faith.

But what does this really mean?

I have heard a number of great questions around the Acts Network, so let me offer a few responses here. We can hit some questions in this Pastor's Page and some in future weeks.

**What could a micro community look like? Variety is the key. A micro community could be a group of musicians who gather each week to "jam out" and build relationships together, then spend time listening to a recorded version of the sermon, and then serve in the community by offering their musical gifts. Or a micro community might be a group of college students who meet weekly for a hike, and while on the hike share in scripture reflection or listen to the sermon and discuss it on the top of the mountain. Or a micro community might include a group of folks living in close proximity who gather each week for a meal, then study together, then seek to serve the very neighbors they live beside.

**Who is the "target" audience of the Acts Network? Those who either do not have faith or are on the fringes of faith.

**How are micro-communities different than small groups? Whereas small groups typically meet once a week for about an hour to study, micro-communities will engage in times of worship, study, life practices, and concrete acts of service on a regular basis. Worship will occur in micro-communities in related (same message or theme) but distinct ways (off-site or at different times) from the rest of First Church.

In a constantly changing world, one of the things that I am most "proud" of with First Church is its relentless pursuit to do whatever it takes to share Jesus Christ with the world. I ask for your continual prayers as we seek to be obedient to God's leading in this next step.
